Cleaning a Granite Monument

- Lots of Water (distilled or from the city)
- Soft cloths and sponges
- Non-ionic soap (check the label) (ex. Reg. Dawn dish soap -blue colour)
- Plastic bristled brushes (finger nail, dishes, tooth brush, etc.)
- Rubber gloves
- 1. Always start cleaning the monument from the bottom upwards.
- 2. Soak the stone with water to saturate any growth that may be present.
- 3. Mix 1 tablespoon of the soap with 1 gallon of water.
- 4. Use the brushes to apply the soapy mixture to the surface and scrub away any debris.
- 5. Keep the stone wet with clean water for the duration of your cleaning.
- 6. Once all of the debris is removed, rinse the stone thoroughly with clean water.

DO NOT USE : Bleach or CLR (will soak into the monument and will do harm), do not use a steel/wire brush or any sander equipment (will scratch the monument), etc.

*Old empty large water bottles are great for brining the water to the cemetery.
