

ON THE DAY OF THE INTERMENT

Urn Interment

On the day of the interment:

- the plot / niche will be opened for interment
- a small table will be provided to place the urn
- the service will be guided by your chosen Funeral Director from the funeral home, your chosen Clergy, or your family / friend
- you have the option of placing the urn yourself, or you can leave the urn on the table and our groundskeeper will place the urn in after you leave
- the groundskeeper will close the plot / niche once you leave
- flowers can be left – they will be removed once they wilt, or if they obstruct maintenance of the cemetery

Casket Interment

On the day of the interment:

- unless the family arranges for an open plot through the funeral home, we do what is called a dry burial, in which the casket is buried after the cemetery service
- the service will be guided by your chosen Funeral Director from the funeral home, your chosen Clergy, or your family / friend
- the groundskeeper will close the plot once you leave
- flowers can be left – they will be removed once they wilt, or if they obstruct maintenance of the cemetery

Further Notes:

- We do offer the use of a 10 x 10 foot sun shelter and chairs for a small fee; you can arrange this up until the day before.
- We ask that you remain at the niche or plot no more than 1/2 hour after your service so that our groundskeeper can finalize his duties. There are some open areas on the Cumberland Street side to congregate and visit with each other.
- Potted plants should be taken home, as they are not allowed to be planted on the plot.
- Donations are always welcome to Woodlawn Cemetery to further beautify the grounds.
