

WOODLAWN CEMETERY DECORATION BY-LAWS:

Page 13 of the By-Laws

J) ITEMS THAT ARE PROHIBITED AND PERMITTED

- The cemetery reserves the right to regulate the articles placed on lots or plots that pose a threat to the safety of all interment rights holders, visitors to the cemetery and cemetery employees, prevents the cemetery from performing general cemetery operations, or are not in keeping with the respect and dignity of the cemetery. Prohibited articles will be removed and disposed of without notification.
- No candle, candle holder or chair, trellis, arch, iron rod, wire work, hanging basket, border, fence, railing wall, cut stone, coping, pottery, glass, metal cross, or wooden article (including wooden crosses and other wooden memorials) or similar articles may be left on any plot.
- The cemetery reserves the right to disallow or remove quantities of memorial wreaths or flowers considered to be excessive and that diminishes the otherwise tidy appearance of the cemetery.

Page 14 of the By-Laws

L) COLUMBARIUM BY-LAWS:

- To ensure quality control, desired uniformity and standard of workmanship, the cemetery reserves the right to inscribe all niche fronts or install all lettering, vases, adornments, or any other approved attachment.
- Nothing shall be permanently attached to a niche or body of columbarium without written cemetery approval.
- No person other than cemetery staff shall remove or alter niche fronts.
- The cemetery reserves the right to disallow or remove quantities of memorial wreaths or flowers considered to be excessive and that diminishes the otherwise tidy appearance of the cemetery.

M) REGULATIONS FOR VISITORS

- Any article which is detrimental to efficient maintenance or constitutes a hazard to machinery, employees or visitors or is unsightly or does not conform with the natural beauty or design of the Cemetery, may be removed by the Grounds Contractor. An article removed will be held at the Administration Office for collection. If not collected, it will be disposed of after thirty (30) days.
